More Classroom Details	 Foundational Skills leading up to Community Based Instruction (CBI) - Weekly outings designed to learn safety and essential skills in context, engage in daily life routines, access community and community spaces, and apply academic skills in context. Foundational learning skills (being in a classroom group, increasing stamina for teacher-led instruction, waiting, sharing, transitions, accepting and tolerating delays, and essential listener skills). Individualized programs are created to increase independence with daily living (participating in cooking, classroom chores, cooking/food prep, expanding food repertoires, hygiene skills, etc.) Social skills practice in the context of social activity clubs (gardening, crafts, science projects, etc.).
